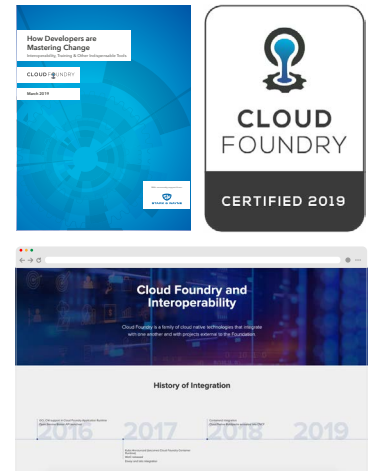

May 2019

The first quarter of 2019 was dedicated to NA Summit planning and alignment on our key messaging for the year. We published a **research report on [How Developers are Mastering Change](#)**, launched our **[Interoperability webpage](#)**, and updated our **[user stories page](#)**. The **Meetup community grew** to ~95,000 people across 160+ groups in 97 cities and 32 countries and **over 22,000 students** have registered for a Cloud Foundry training course. The Foundation welcomed **two new Gold Representatives on the Board of Directors** for 2019 and has **seven certified providers** of Cloud Foundry.

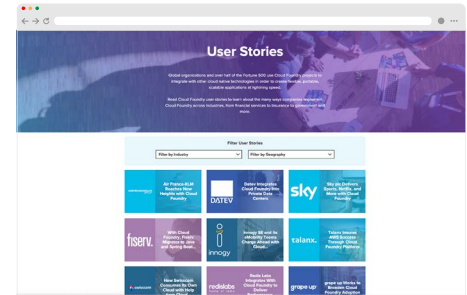
CONTENT

Our blog received almost 40,000 pageviews in the first quarter, making it a continually successful medium for reaching our industry. In addition to publishing user stories and executive bylines on our site and personal blog sites like Medium and LinkedIn, we contributed bylines and user stories to third-party publications including Forbes and The New Stack in order to reach a broader audience. We published a research report in January called [How Developers are Mastering Change: Interoperability, Training & Other Indispensable Tools](#), based on the eighth global perception study, and prepared for early Q2 publication of a report based on data from the ninth study.



USER STORIES

We rolled out a new user stories web page and user interface in Q1 with an updated url and filtered search option so readers can peruse stories by region and vertical. Eight new user stories were published in Q1 in the new format, which received more than 5,200 pageviews.



DIGITAL

- **Website:** The Cloud Foundry Foundation website received 134k new visitors which accounted for 72 percent of website visits and over 390,000 unique pageviews in Q1. The top three pages visited included the 2019 Cloud Foundry NA Summit landing page, Get Started, and Why Cloud Foundry. A new page around Cloud Foundry Interoperability was launched and several pages were updated with new design elements.
- **Member Engagement:** In Q1, members drove 1,687 sessions to the Cloud Foundry Summit landing page and received 25 member benefits for their efforts, including report sponsorships and tickets to Cloud Foundry Summit.



EVENTS AND SPEAKING

During the first quarter, the team attended and spoke at several industry events. Winter event season is somewhat quieter than the remainder of the year, so the team took the opportunity to attend key events and prepare for Q2's Cloud Foundry Summit.

- In March, the executive team attended the Open Source Leadership Summit where Swarna spoke. Abby attended Lobby: Enterprise in Hawaii and IDC Directions in Santa Clara.

INDUSTRY OPINION RESEARCH

In the first half of the year, we continued to conduct different internal and external research streams to provide Foundation leadership, members and the industry at large with insights on market trends, tracking for technology adoption and metrics on IT decision maker satisfaction and progress in their cloud journey.

- **Global Perception Study 9:** In Q1, the Foundation shared its findings from our February survey research. The research continues to track adoption and awareness of different technologies, as well as key market trends. This wave demonstrated a significant maturation in companies' understanding that their digital transformation journeys are gradual and continual, not simply a flip of a switch. A series of papers based on the results will be released in Q2 2019.

PROJECT LIFECYCLE AND LEAD CHANGES

- The Routing and CF Networking projects have been merged into one, Networking. Read about this [here](#). Shubha Anjur Tupil was accepted as the new lead for the Networking project.
- Preethi Varambally is the new lead for the CF Infrastructure project.
- BPM has been [proposed](#) and accepted as an active project in the BOSH PMC, with Chris Brown (Pivotal) as project lead.
- The BOSH Core SF and Toronto teams have been merged, and a secondary team, BOSH Systems, has been spun off to focus on stemcells and DNS.
- Elliot Shanks is the new project lead for the Buildpacks team.
- The App-Autoscaler [has graduated](#) from the cloudfoundry-incubator to become an active project.
- The BPM project [has graduated](#) from the cloudfoundry-incubator to become an active project under the BOSH PMC.

NOTABLE PROJECT UPDATES

- The BOSH PMC is now holding monthly meetings at 8am PST on the third Thursday of each month. Read about that [here](#), and the PMC Notes repository (hot tip: this is also a great resource for keeping up with changes in other PMC projects). The BOSH team [has announced](#) the removal of support for v1 manifests, and has asked for feedback on this.
- CF-Dev [v0.0.13](#) is now available. Read about that [here](#).
- The Buildpack team announced the end of support for various buildpack dependencies. The .NET buildpack will no longer include any version of .NET Core v2.0.x, as these .NET Core versions are no longer supported upstream. Read about that [here](#). The newer version of the PHP buildpack will no longer include PHP v5.0.x or v7.0.x. Read about that [here](#). Go versions 1.8x and 1.9x. [Here](#). Node v6.x will no longer be supported, and the default version in the Node Buildpack will now be v10.x. Read about that [here](#).

- 10 of these notices were Cloud Foundry CVEs, with the remaining 20 from upstream projects.



Developer Training and Certification

- Over **22,000 students** have registered for either the [one-day MOOC](#) or [four-day developer trainings](#) hosted by The Linux Foundation.
- Work has begun on version 2 of the Cloud Foundry Certified Developer exam, with associated updates to the Cloud Foundry For Developers course material. Expect a call for volunteers to test the new exam to be shared with the development mailing list.



Community Management

2019 launched with a refreshed level of engagement and energy from both the Foundation staff and the community.



USER ENGAGEMENT

In early February, we restarted the User Advisory Council meetings. These calls are structured to provide a forum for Cloud Foundry end users to have open discussions with their peers. These discussions enable users to share their experiences and tips with their peers while also helping the Foundation understand how users are evaluating and adopting Cloud Foundry technology and related projects.

The kick-off call in February helped build the agenda for User Day at Cloud Foundry NA Summit that was extremely useful and relevant for all users. Starting in May, we will continue our monthly meetings.



CLOUD FOUNDRY AMBASSADORS AND LINUX FOUNDATION PARTNERSHIP

During late 2018, we sought mentors from the Cloud Foundry Ambassadors group to mentor newcomers and help them get acquainted with different aspects, including getting started with Cloud Foundry or becoming a technical or non-technical contributor. Combined with this, the Linux Foundation announced the [CommunityBridge](#) program that provides a simpler way for community members to sign up to be a mentor or a mentee. Cloud Foundry is now [listed](#) as a project and is open to recruiting both mentors and mentees.

MEETUPS

The global Cloud Foundry meetup member community has grown to ~95,000 people across 160+ groups in 97 cities and 32 countries. CLOUD FOUNDRY DAYS

[Cloud Foundry Days](#) bring Cloud Foundry to a regional audience curated by hosting members. In Q4, the Cloud Foundry Foundation hosted two Cloud Foundry Days co-located at Kubecon Shanghai and Kubecon North America 2018 with ~100 attendees at each event.



AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

The [Cloud Foundry Ambassador program](#), which began in 2016, has steadily gained momentum since its inception. A few key highlights of this program are:

- The Ambassadors have continued to represent the community and evangelize the technology at regional Meetups, Cloud Foundry Days (as speakers and program chairs), and Cloud Foundry Summit (as speakers, program co-chairs, and advocates to make our community welcoming).

Membership and Operations

Cloud Foundry EU Summit 2019: The [2019 European Summit](#) will be held in The Hague, Netherlands, from September 11-12, 2019.



Membership: Cloud Foundry Foundation has 61 members. We added one new Silver member in January 2019, SkySilk. We had six members depart, including Anchora, Cisco, Cloudsoft Corporation, Royal Bank of Canada, mimacom and Toshiba.

Certified Distributions: Cloud Foundry has seven Certified Distributions in 2019: Atos, Cloud.gov, IBM, Pivotal, SAP, SUSE, and Swisscom. This number is down from eight in 2018, as Huawei ceased their own distribution at the end of 2018.

Board of Directors: The Foundation welcomed two new Gold Representatives on the Board of Directors for 2019: Alan Flower, HCL Technologies, and Stephan Massalt, Swisscom.



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
